Where is it?

Steven Fancy and Sue Reneau Damewood, who have compiled the Genealogy of the Reno/Reneau Family in America, 1600-1920 have asked us to spread the word to see if we can find out what happened to the "Old Family Bible" of John Reno and Susannah Thorne. Steve has a copy of a letter dated Dec. 9, 1937 form I. A. Reneau (Isaac Tipton Alexander Reneau, born Mar. 11, 1859, son of Isaac Tipton Reneau and Mary Gipton Wood) of Broken Bow, NE, to Mrs. Luther Davis of Chatterfield, AR. In this letter, he says that Charles Reno. (b. 1743, son of John and Susanna Reno) moved to French Broad River above Knoxville in 1799, "carrying with him the original family Bible belonging to John and Susanna, in which was written the names of all the members of the original family and many names of the succeeding families of whom this Charles and his family was a part."

He goes on to say that "in some stowaway place I have a copy of the names taken from the old Bible described and sent me by an uncle of mine which whom the Bible was passed down from Charles to John and by him to his youngest son Berry to be given to my father, but this transfer was never made. However, the book was accessible at all times to members of our immediate family, all of whom examined it with great curiosity as well as veneration."

Thus, the original Reno family Bible still existed in the 1930s. Steve has searched various archives, but has not been able to find out where the "old Bible" is.

Does anyone have any leads to follow? Let us know and we will forward the information to Steve. We'll also post any developments in the "Reneau Review."

From Dolley McAllister Elliott

I would love to be able to come to San Antonio for the Reneau Reunion, but I am 83 years old and physically handicapped, so I travel no more.

I have written several published articles on the Reneaus, the first needed correcting as to our emigrant ancestor as, at the time, I had ambiguous information; otherwise, the article is correct. Later, I received a photocopy from The Huguenot Society of London of a page from King James II's Bounty Papers, showing our emigrant ancestor to be Lewis "Reynaud" of Angoumois, France, wife Anne (surname unknown, or unproved, to date), and children: Lewis, Francis, Sara, and Mary. I have the line written up in my manuscript from the emigrant ancestors except Anne's surname and the name of Lewis, Jr.'s, first wife, our ancestress, down to and including the children of John and Elizabeth (Thurman).Reneau. Unfortunately, I do

not have our Thurman line.

Incidentally, I had always felt there was a Washington connection, as Elizabeth Thurman named almost all her children Washington-connected names: Nathan Washington, Nathaniel Smith, Elizabeth Wakefield, Joseph Wright, et al. I kept telling interested people that Elizabeth Thurman Reneau was trying to tell her descendants their ancestry; most did not believe me. Years later, I was proved correct when I obtained a photocopy of a letter from Isaac Tipton Reneau's niece in Paducah, KY (her name escapes me at the moment) asking him for a new chart showing their descent from Grandmother Elizabeth Thurman Reneau's Washington line, as her copy was destroyed, or lost, during the Civil War. I have tried unsuccessfully to find someone who might still have such a chart. Could you, or someone at the Reunion, announce and ask who might know of the chart? The letter is in the West Virginia University Library, and I have a copy of it.

`The question is not IF we have a Washington line, but which one. Contemporary with Col. John Washington of Westmoreland Co., VA (Pres. George's ancestor) was a John Washington in the southern VA county of Surry. This John was grandfather of a George Washington, born well before the date of the president.

This George married a Mary Wright, probably the daughter Joseph Wright, as, years later, Elizabeth Thurman Reneau named a son Joseph Wright Reneau. HOWEVER, the Westmoreland Co. Washingtons also had a Wright connection, and the name Nathaniel Washington appears several times in their direct lineage. Nathan Washington Reneau was undoubtedly named for him; as she had already used "Nathaniel", they named him Nathan. The question is: was Elizabeth aware of the Surry Co., VA, John Washington or, not knowing, jumped to the conclusion she was of the Westmoreland line, or did she know that, in fact, the Westmoreland line was hers? I would love to have the answer to this; perhaps future researchers could pursue this? When my mother was orphaned at 9 years old, she went to live temporarily with Cousin Mariah Depp, of your (Isaac Tipton Reneau) line.

I would love to have any written material from the Reunion, including the Jonathan Mulkey descendants who attend, and their addresses if I could.

My thoughts will be with you and I know you'll have a very successful and most interesting get-together. Should anyone attend who knows me, as several have corresponded with me over the years and read my articles, please tell them "hello" for me and that I wish I could be with "y'all (sorry, that's my Tennessee hangover).
